

IS YOUR FAMILY SAFE FROM LEAD POISONING?

Lead is found in dust and paint in most homes built before 1978. When children come in contact with lead dust or paint chips, it can cause lifelong health problems.

The most at risk households include:

- Pregnant women or those planning to become pregnant
- Families with small children
- Caregivers for small children

The good news is that poisoning from lead is 100% preventable!

Lead Safety Checklist

- Clean up dust and paint chips with wet mop or rag
- Eat healthy foods like fruits & vegetables
- Do not wear shoes or work clothes in the home
- Do not put children furniture and or toys near windows
- Do not let children play with old toys, jewelry or other things that may contain lead. Check to see if those things have lead in them.

- Early blood test for lead can help reduce long-term health problems.
- Health care providers can do a simple blood test to check for lead. In Connecticut two tests must be done before every child's 3rd birthday.
- Very small amount of lead can cause brain damage and learning disabilities.

- Most children get lead poisoning from paint in homes built before 1978.
- Toys and other things with lead in them are still sold in the United States.
